Final exam = 30% of your grade

If you must miss an exam or quiz for some pressing reason, be sure to talk to me *beforehand*.

Important Note: Even though a grade of D is considered “passing” at Tennessee Tech, I do not believe that a grade of D in Calculus I indicates sufficient progress to successfully complete Calculus II. Similarly, earning a grade of D in this class does not mean that you are ready to successfully tackle the material in Calculus III.

Extra Credit: I may give a few extra-credit problems. They are mostly for your own enjoyment. Extra credits are totaled separately, and will *not* effect your class average. If your final average falls near a borderline and you have some extra credit, then you will get the higher grade.
